CLEANUP AFTER A SEWAGE BACKUP

<u>OBJECTIVE</u>: To remove all sources of contamination from all surfaces and equipment that came into contact with raw sewage.

- I. Do not allow children or pets into the flooded area during cleanup.
- II. The following are suggestions on how to clean up a sewage problem.

A. <u>Cleaning and Sanitizing</u>

- 1. Drain all sewage by natural draining or pumping.
- 2. Remove debris from all surfaces that came into contact with the raw sewage.
- 3. Wash down all contaminated walls, floors, and surfaces with clean, hot water and a low suds detergent.
- 4. Rinse again with hot water.
- 5. Sanitize by rinsing walls, floors, and surfaces using 8 tablespoons of laundry bleach for every gallon of water used. Ensure a minimum of 10 seconds of contact time with all affected surfaces.
- 6. Air out the areas by opening windows or using fans.
- 7. Prevent tracking flood debris and sewage into clean areas.

B. Utilities

- 1. Do not touch the fuse box or any plugged in cords or appliances until the electricity is shut off.
- 2. If an electrical appliance or its controls are submerged under water, do not start it until consulting with the dealer or service company.
- 3. Do not relight gas appliances until checked by the gas company.

C. Food and Clothing

1. Discard all contaminated bottled and boxed foods.

- 2. Canned goods may be kept if cleaned thoroughly or submerged in chlorinated water for 15 minutes.
- 3. Clothing, Furniture, Carpets, etc. should be discarded unless they are cleaned and disinfected according to manufacturer's recommendations.

D. Personal Hygiene

- 1. Proper hand washing consisting of:
 - a. Detergent/antibacterial soap
 - b. Short bristled scrub brush to clean nails, cuticles, and finger joints.
 - c. Adequate and through washing
- 2. Proper hand washing prevents:
 - a. Self-contamination
 - b. Reduces the spread of infection to others
- 3. Never eat, drink, smoke or use smokeless tobacco prior to hand washing.
- 4. Avoid touching the face, mouth, eyes, ears, or nose before hand washing.

E. Sanitizing of Equipment

- 1. All equipment that came in contact with wastewater should be washed on the exterior with warm water and detergent.
- 2. Sanitize exterior surfaces using eight tablespoons of laundry bleach for every gallon of water used. A minimum contact time of ten seconds is required.
- 3. Interior of Pumps:
 - a. Rinse with clean water, several times.
 - b. Pump a solution of eight tablespoons of laundry bleach for every gallon of water used through the pump for a minimum of ten seconds. Follow manufacturer's recommendations if noted.
