# SWATARA TOWNSHIP BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING II FEBRUARY 13, 2019

- <u>Call to Order</u>: The Regular Meeting II of the Swatara Township Board of Commissioners was called to order at 7:05 PM by President Connolly on Wednesday, February 13, 2019, Township Administration Building, 599 Eisenhower Blvd., Swatara, PA 17111.

- 4. <u>Roll Call</u>: Commissioners Bouder, Connolly, Troxell, Varner and Zubeck were present. - 5. <u>Motion to Approve Agenda</u>: Commissioner Varner made a motion to approve tonight's agenda as presented, seconded by Commissioner Bouder. Motion carried unanimously.

- 7. <u>Consideration of Minutes Regular Meeting I January 2, 2019</u>: Commissioner Bouder moved to approve the minutes as presented. Commissioner Varner seconded the motion; carried unanimously.

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### 10. <u>Reports</u>

A. <u>Manager's Report</u>: Township Manager Fosselman presented his January report to the Board. He also reported the Liquid Fuels Fund was audited for 2016/2017. The audit was passed. The Township is financially sound.

B. <u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Commissioner Bouder made a motion to accept the January 2019 treasurer's report. Seconded by Commissioner Troxell. Motion carried unanimously.

C. <u>Solicitor's Report</u>: Nothing to Report:

D. <u>Stormwater Report</u>: Tom Wilson reported on working with Central Dauphin School District and PennDOT regarding flooding concerns on Highland Street. He's also working with the Highway Department on flooding and freezing on Garden Drive. The watershed bills went out in a timely manner. He is working with Norfolk Southern on stormwater strategies on Grayson Road. Pleased to announce the township received a \$120,000 grant for Spring Creek Restoration and the Implementation of a Growing Greener Grant. Currently working on a stormwater management ordinance for residences.

E. <u>Swatara Rising Comp Plan Report</u>: Building and Codes Director Ihlein gave an update on the Comprehensive Plan Report. The new name is "Swatara Rising 2025 Implementable Comprehensive Plan". The three main categories of projects included in the plan are Transportation, Improving Neighborhoods and Economic Development. One action item for consideration is a motion to appoint one Commissioner to be the Chair of a Committee that will oversee each of the categories. A vote will be held at a later time. Mr. Ihlein is working with the South Hanover Township Board of Supervisors and their experience with their Comprehensive Plan.

F. <u>Fire Services Report</u>: Chief Ibberson presented his January report to the Board. He extended his thanks to the Highway Department for the great job they did during the snow which made their job easier. He spoke about the success of an incentive program for volunteer fireman in order to try to have firehouses manned more.

G. <u>Director of Public Safety Report</u>: Chief Reider presented his monthly report for January. He also spoke regarding the Township Police Department taking advantage of free training seminars through grants. Swatara K-9 Kix assisted the US Marshalls in the apprehension of a suspect in York, PA.
