

FALL LEAF COLLECTION

BEGINS OCTOBER 16th



Bagged leaves in brown paper yard waste bags or raked leaves placed curbside will be collected

according to the following schedule:

Monday: Chambers Hill Tuesday: Rutherford & President Drive Area Wednesday: Lawnton and Lenker Manor Thursday: Oberlin, Oberlin Gardens, and 29th Street Area Friday: Enhaut and Bressler

Here are a few important reminders that will help make leaf collection go smoothly. Have your leaves ready for pick up the night before your scheduled day. Crews start collecting as early as 7:30AM and leaves raked out once the crew passes will not be collected until the following week.

- Please refrain from raking leaves into the street because they easily clog the storm sewer grates and cause flooding. If you have a storm drain adjacent to your property, please try to keep it cleaned off.
- If crews are unable to complete an area on any given day, they will resume the following week exactly where they left off. Past experience has been that Wednesday's areas are the most difficult to complete in one day.
- If you see the leaf crew in your neighborhood on an unscheduled day, it means that they have completed the scheduled day's area and are either (1) getting a

head start on the next area due to predicted rain or (2) returning to an area they were previously unable to complete.

- The leaf machines are vacuums designed to pick up leaves only. Sticks will clog the machines and cause delays.
- Please park cars, boats, trailers, and portable basketball hoops in your driveway (if you have one) on leaf collection days. Leaves are collected more efficiently if crews do not have to work around these items.
- Keep leaves separate from your garbage. Neither the Township nor the trash hauler will pick up bags containing a mixture of leaves and garbage.
- Leaf collection requires the concentrated efforts of all our Public Works workers, all day, every day, for at least a month. Issues other than leaf collection will be addressed on a priority basis.
- Holidays, equipment malfunctions, and bad weather all try to interfere with our leaf collection efforts. Our goal is to have the majority of the leaves collected by the first snowfall. If snowfall is predicted, the leaf boxes must be removed, and the trucks get tailgates and salt spreaders put on.
- Residents may take their own leaves to the composting facility on Kelker Street, no permit is required if you are only taking leaves to the facility.

President's Corner

Collectively, the Swatara Township Public Works Department is responsible for, but not limited to, roads, park maintenance, stormwater maintenance, as well as municipal facilities.

The Public Works Department is responsible for a variety of infrastructure and yard waste tasks, including road maintenance and repairs, leaf pickup, snow removal and after-hour emergencies including downed trees and flooding issues.

The crew designated primarily for parks is responsible for 183 acres of Township-owned Park land (18 parks), not including the mowing, plowing, and salting at other Township-owned property and facilities.

The Public Works Department also maintains all Township equipment, including fire apparatus and vehicles, police vehicles and staff vehicles.

We also have a crew within Public Works primarily responsible for the operation and maintenance of the Township stormwater system. The stormwater system consists of 350,000 linear feet of underground pipes in Swatara Township, not including the drainage structures, bioswales, and outfalls that discharge to waterways. The staff is also responsible for compliance with National Pollution Discharge Elimination Systems (NPDES), Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS-4) Permit and administering the Townships Stormwater Management Program.

As you can see, Public Works includes a broad range of services that we provide to residents, businesses, and visitors of Swatara Township. Without Public Works, potholes would act as a barrier to passage for vehicles. Without Public Works, our roads might be impassable in the winter when it snows. Our Public Works Department staff is on call and ready to respond to any emergency such as stormwater issues, sinkholes, and snowstorms. The crew works to make sure our residents are provided with the necessities and quality of life that taxpayers expect of the municipality in which they live. The Public Works Budget for 2023 was \$2,524,061 to provide services to the residents. The Public Works Department ranks second in budgeted expenditures, first is the Police Department.

Over the last 2 years we have worked to reduce our Engineering expenses. Engineering cost in 2020 was \$644,625 and in 2021 the cost was reduced to \$158,871 with a savings of \$485,754, Then in 2022 the cost was reduced to \$154,314. Engineering expenses thus have been reduced since 2020 by \$490,311. The savings provide funds to be used on other projects within the township.

Before I move on to some of our most recent accomplishments, I would like to thank these crucial workers and ask that you take a moment to appreciate those who work to provide us with these services.

Swatara Township has approximately 100 miles of roads. In my first term as Commissioner, in 2018, I came on the Board with one of my priorities being to focus on infrastructure and public safety, which I think goes hand in hand. It came as a shock when I learned that our Township had not done a paving project in double-digit years and as Chair of the Highway Department (name changed in 2020 to Public Works), I was determined to reinvigorate our paving program. It was one of my most proud accomplishments when we began our first Township projects on East Park Drive and Garden Drive. Now, as President of the Board of Commissioners, and Chair of Public Works, along with my colleagues, we reupped on the commitment to show residents that their tax dollars are hard at work.

We have paved, contracted, or partnered to rehabilitate approximately 4 miles of roadway, not including all the stormwater projects we have undertaken. As you may know, it is very expensive and time consuming to rehabilitate a neglected road; and depending on the project, you can figure it might be at least \$1 million a mile. Most recent projects include:

• Derry Street which was a complete rehabilitation of underground facilities and road surface from 63rd Street to Nyes Road.

• Numerous roads in Rutherford were milled and overlayed as part of waterline replacement projects with Suez Water, now Veolia.

• Old Nyes Road was milled, overlayed and stormwater was replaced to avoid flooding.

• Roads in Lenker Manor were milled and overlayed this summer by Township staff.

• Removal of Norfolk Southern rail crossing on Grayson Road. The Rail was removed and paved on May 9, 2022. Rupp Hill Road/Grayson Road reconstruction is being finalized and the work will be completed soon.

We also have many stormwater projects which either coincide with the road projects or are stand-alone. One of our major projects in 2023 is the Spring Creek stream restoration project in cooperation with PennDOT to rehabilitate and reroute Spring Creek from Living Waters Church downstream to the Bonnymeade Bridge. The Spring Creek project will be completed this month and will aid in reducing flooding in the Lenker Manor neighborhood as well as improve the stream quality of Spring Creek.

The Stormwater crew has repaired or replaced 78 inlets and 480 linear feet of pipe over the last few years to mitigate the potential of residential flooding as well as upgrades to infrastructure. We also had over 300 linear feet of stormwater pipe that was failing.

Stormwater staff are also in the design phase to realign and replace stormwater pipes on Highland Street at the rear entrance of Swatara Middle School. This area is the 2nd largest road in the Township and experiences frequent flooding. This project will alleviate flooding and improve failing infrastructure.

The Compost Facility now has 7 municipalities bringing brush and leaves to our facility to be processed. These municipalities pay a fee to Swatara Township to utilize our facility. The Swatara Township compost facility is the largest such facility in the area and has become a regional facility with Swatara Township and PA Department of Environmental Protection is proud of helping other municipalities. These Intermunicipal Agreements aid Swatara Township in achieving grant funds from DEP to maintain and operate the Compost Facility.

Francis Cadden Parkway Phase 2

Dewey Street Guiderail Replacement

Highland Street Connectivity and Sidewalk

Finally, one of the many concerns I receive from residents is regarding potholes that sometimes go unnoticed. Consequently, I would like to highlight our newest technological endeavor, our Pothole Reporting System. We will be putting out How-To information to help every resident navigate our Pothole Reporting Application (app). We need your help in identifying and reporting potholes to repair our roads. You will be able to fill out our simple form on smartphones, tablets, and desktop/ laptop computers. While this is being provided as a convenience, for those who still wish to call or email, we will still welcome your preferred method of contacting us.

Grass In The Streets

When mowing grass please take precautions not to discharge cut grass into the roadway. Cut grass in the roadway can cause clogging of stormsewer inlets and pipes. Grass entering the stormwater infrastructure will contribute to sediment in creeks and streams. Equally important, grass discharge into the street is a violation of the Swatara Township Property Maintenance Code. A fine to the property owner can result by not adhering to this Code. You can see from the pictures below that grass discharged into the street ends up into the stormsewer system.



Compost Facility

The Swatara Township Compost Facility will remain open for the season until Tuesday, October 31st, 2023. The facility is open Monday through Friday 8 a.m. - 3.p.m. and Saturdays from 8 a.m. – 2 p.m.

Street Sweeping

Weather permitting, the Public Works Department will be around your neighborhoods with its two street sweepers to begin cleaning roadways. Overhead Wires On Trees

The Township often gets calls from residents regarding overhead wires on tree limbs or being pulled down by tree limbs. The Swatara Township Public Works Department is not permitted to remove limbs from wires. We will contact utilities to let them know there is an issue. We also encourage property owners to call as well.

Swatara Township Stormwater Authority

What is **Stormwater**? *Stormwater* is water that originates from precipitation, including not only rain, but snow and hail as well. This water collects on the grass and pavement and eventually finds its way to a body of water or a drain. During its travel, stormwater will pick up chemicals from fuel and salt on the road, in addition to common yard practices of fertilizer and weed killer use. The federal government has tasked each state, and therefore county and township, to control just how much of these substances enter our environment and lower the levels as much as possible.

Spotlight Topic: Create a Healthy Lawn Without Creating Excess Stormwater Pollution

The days are growing shorter as we close out the summer and welcome the fall. Many property owners will be raking leaves and cleaning up yard debris to prepare for the coming winter. We would like to offer a few helpful tips to meet your lawn's

needs while reducing stormwater pollution.

 Please dispose of your leaves and yard waste appropriately. Leaves should only be placed at your curb during the pickup cycle and kept away from inlets, but never dump them into a stream. You are welcome to bring your waste to our compost facility located on Kelker Street. Please contact the Township for more information.

- 2. This is a common time to fertilize your lawn, but we would like to remind you to be mindful. Do not apply chemicals excessively or right before a storm. Always follow the directions on the container and reduce your chemical use as much as possible to help the environment and keep your family safe.
- 3. **Plant. Native. Plants.** Please consider adding native plants to your property. Most species will fall dormant during the fall and winter and will not need much maintenance until the warmer months of spring and summer. They offer food and habitat for our local wildlife while offering a means of infiltration for stormwater. Please visit the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR)'s website for more information and workshops.

Safety Tips On Using Propane (LPG)

From the Fire & EMS Department and Building & Codes Department

Liquid Petroleum Gas (LPG) is a common fuel source for heating and cooking . LPG cylinders are safe when used correctly.

What precautions should be taken when using LP gas?



When using LPG cylinders

- always ensure adequate ventilation and never use indoors or in confined spaces.
- always read the manufacturers operating instructions.
- do not connect or disconnect cylinders near a naked flame.
- do not use LPG in windy conditions.
- always keep cylinders cool and away from flames, sparks and heat

Before getting started

- Make sure your gas connections are tight.
- Turn on the cylinder valve and test for leaks. You can do this by using a squirt bottle or brush and coating the gas connections and hose with soapy water. Get into the habit of regularly checking for leaks every time you use your LP Gas appliance.
- If bubbles start forming, there is a gas leak.
- Turn off the gas cylinder valve. Disconnect the left hand thread connection and check that the faces are clean.
- Check the rubber Bull Nosing or O-Ring is not damaged

and is present on the hose that connects the appliances to the LPG cylinder valve. Leaks are caused by damaged or missing O-Rings or rubber Bull Nosing or where connections are not tight.

- Check for cracks or damage on the hose or a damaged gas regulator, which may need replacing. Always take care when reconnecting.
- Turn the gas back on and test everything again with soapy water.
- If bubbles are still forming, turn off the gas supply and do not use the gas appliance. Contact a licensed gasfitter to replace the gas hose and regulator assembly.
- After you have finished using your LP Gas appliance, you should always close the cylinder valve first before turning off the LP Gas appliance.
- Keep your LP Gas appliance clean and in good condition.

From Swatara Township to El Salvador with Love

Bertie Bouder was known for her generosity. Married to Swatara Township Commissioner Richard Bouder for 64 years, this mother and grandmother liked few things more than doing good for others.

Four months after her death, she continues to do good deeds. After she died, Commissioner Bouder gave me three pairs of her glasses to take on a medical mission to a Third World country so that Bertie could give the gift of better sight to someone. (I am a medical missionary nurse. I usually run glasses clinics on the missions, using prescription glasses, regular sunglasses and safety glasses which township residents leave for me in a marked box in the township building lobby. This El Salvador trip was my 57th international medical mission.)

Many people in my El Salvador clinics tried on Bertie's glasses but couldn't see with them. Then, an 80-year-old lady named Berta came to me and said she needed help. I used my eye charts to test her vision then tried to find the right glasses for her. She couldn't see out of any of the other glasses I brought. Then, I handed her a pair of Bertie's glasses.

NEW Blue Neighbors Program for Seniors Coming to Swatara Township



Officers immediately responded to the area and through exhaustive efforts were able to locate the individual in a wooded area and kept them from harming themself.

Award of Merit: Det Sgt Baluh, Ofc Glass, on November 20, 2022, Officer Glass responded to an area hotel for a report of possible human trafficking. Glass made contact with the involved individuals. During his on-scene investigation, he determined that human trafficking was not involved, however he did find indicators of other criminal activity which led to obtaining a search warrant and the seizing of evidence. Detective Sergeant Baluh was assigned as lead investigator in this case. Her further investigation led to the uncovering of numerous fraudulent unemployment compensation claims. Detective Sergeant Baluh concluded the case with filing over 18 felony charges.


