

Did You Know?

All seven species of sea turtles are endangered, which means their populations are very low. After a turtle eats a plastic bag, it sits in their stomach and cannot be broken down. Afterwards, the sea turtle no longer feels hungry and it won't eat the food it needs. 
Help the Baby Sea Turtle Find His Way to the Ocean



Did You Know?

Most female sea turtles will lay eggs on the same beach they were born on. After traveling thousands of miles, they can still find their way back! Once hatched on the sand, baby sea turtles use the moonlight to find their way to the ocean. Many coastal areas encourage beachfront homes to keep their lights off at night during nesting season so the baby turtles don't get confused!"

Color by Number Seahorse










Did You Know?

Lionfish deliver venom through their needle-like dorsal fins. If you see one of these beautiful creatures swimming, don't touch!


Invasive species alert! This animal was transported to the East coast of the U.S and the Caribbean, and is now taking over those habitats since it has no natural predators.













Frogs are mostly freshwater animals, but there are some species of frogs that can tolerate salt water and have adapted to thrive in coastal environments.








